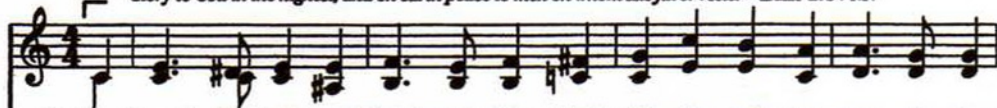


I Heard the Bells on Christmas Day 126
